The students then voted on their preferred candidate for Youth Parliament based on short videos they watched of three young people. Well done to all of our students for participating.








World Book Day 2024

Well done to our Catering Team



Well done to Archie Harris-Joy who was successful in the recent National swimming league Final where he won the 100m backstroke. Amazing!





In history our aims are to allow students the knowledge to gain a thoughtful, respectful, kind and open- minded attitude to cultures, beliefs and ideas outside their own experience. We also aim to allow students to meet their aspirations by encouraging development of a life-long love of learning. This should allow students to have the knowledge and skills to be able to understand and make a respectful contribution to their communities.

The history teachers at Flegg are Mr Sandall, Mr Williams and Mr Hanner.....

Mr Sandall – Subject Leader: My favourite periods of history to teach are the British Civil War of the 17th Century, the 20th Century, especially WW1, and the Holocaust. I personally think the Holocaust is incredibly important to learn about so that students understand the importance of (in the words of Susan Taubbe a Holocaust survivor) 'keep an eye out for their neighbours.'

Mr Williams: Although I generally prefer modern history, I am currently really enjoying learning more about Medieval and Early Modern England. At the moment, I am reading Ian Mortimer's *Time Travellers guide to Elizabethan England*, and I am thoroughly enjoying finding out about this period of time! I have also been learning more about the *Silk Roads* and their impact on Britain and the wider world. In terms of modern history, I love finding more about Britain after the Second World War and how this period shaped the world we live in today.

Mr Hanner: I love reading about all areas of History, but I particularly love the intrigue and politics of the Plantagenet period. I have recently been learning more about European and Asian history and have been learning about the growth and fall of the Ottoman Empire.







