This week, our book club celebrated the final stages of this year's Carnegie award; the results! Every year, students from book club read the books that are up for the prize and give their own opinions as to which one should win.

The students compiled their reviews to create a list of potential and worthy winners. However just like in previous years, our results were different from the judges! We did agree with the shadower's choice though.

This year's winner is 'The Boy Lost in the Maze' by Joseph Coelho; a story about two boys, separated by centuries, parted by myth, divided by reality. Two boys who are hoping to be men. Two boys severed from their fathers. Two boys searching a maze of manhood. It is told in poems blending the legend of Theseus and the Minotaur with the quest of a modern-day teenage boy to find his biological father. Joseph Coelho is the children's laureate, with poetry his passion.

The Shadower's choice was awarded to 'Crossing the Line' by Tia Fisher. This is a gripping read; compelling, gutsy, and important. A debut novel written in verse and a powerful story about impossible choices, involving gangs, drugs, and county lines.

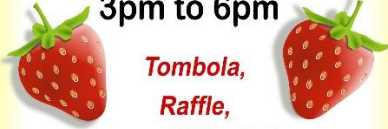
