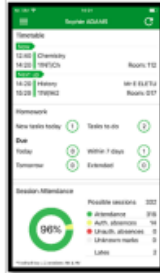

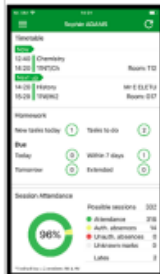
**Timetable:**  
From the main screen tap on the timetable for more information.



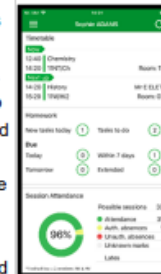
**Timetable detail:**  
You are then presented with today's timetable. You can tap or swipe to previous and future days at the top.



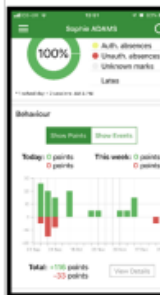
**Attendance:**  
From the main screen scroll down to view attendance information. A chart displays the overall percentage attendance.



The App will also display detail about specific attendance marks including authorised and unauthorised attendance marks. Late marks are incorporated into the overall attendance marks and unknown marks are waiting for confirmation of the reason for the absence.  
**NOTE:** There are two possible sessions in a school day, AM and PM.



**Behaviour:**  
Continue to scroll down the app to the Behaviour information. This will display a bar chart of both negative and positive behaviour points over time, the chart can be scrolled across throughout the year. Positive points are shown in green and negative points in red with a total points count.

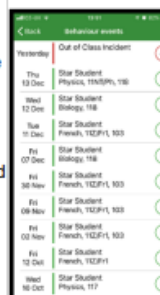


If you prefer you can toggle the graph to show the number of events rather than points. This will allow you to see the number of positive and negative events recorded over time. Again, you can scroll the chart across and positive events are in green and negative events in red.

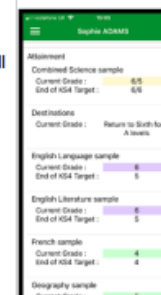


**Behaviour detail:**  
If you tap the 'details' button or tap in the white space around the behaviour chart you can then view your detailed event record including the date, the subject, the event type and the associated points.

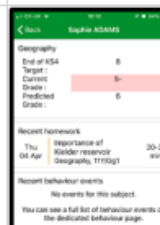
This is useful to see if teachers have recorded events they have spoken to you about.



**Attainment:**  
Scrolling down further, you can see the attainment card. This will display your current grades and colouring of your progress, if shared by your school.



**Subject detail:**  
If you tap on a specific subject you can see an overview of attainment, behaviour and homework for that subject.



You can easily return to the main screen by using the '< back' button.

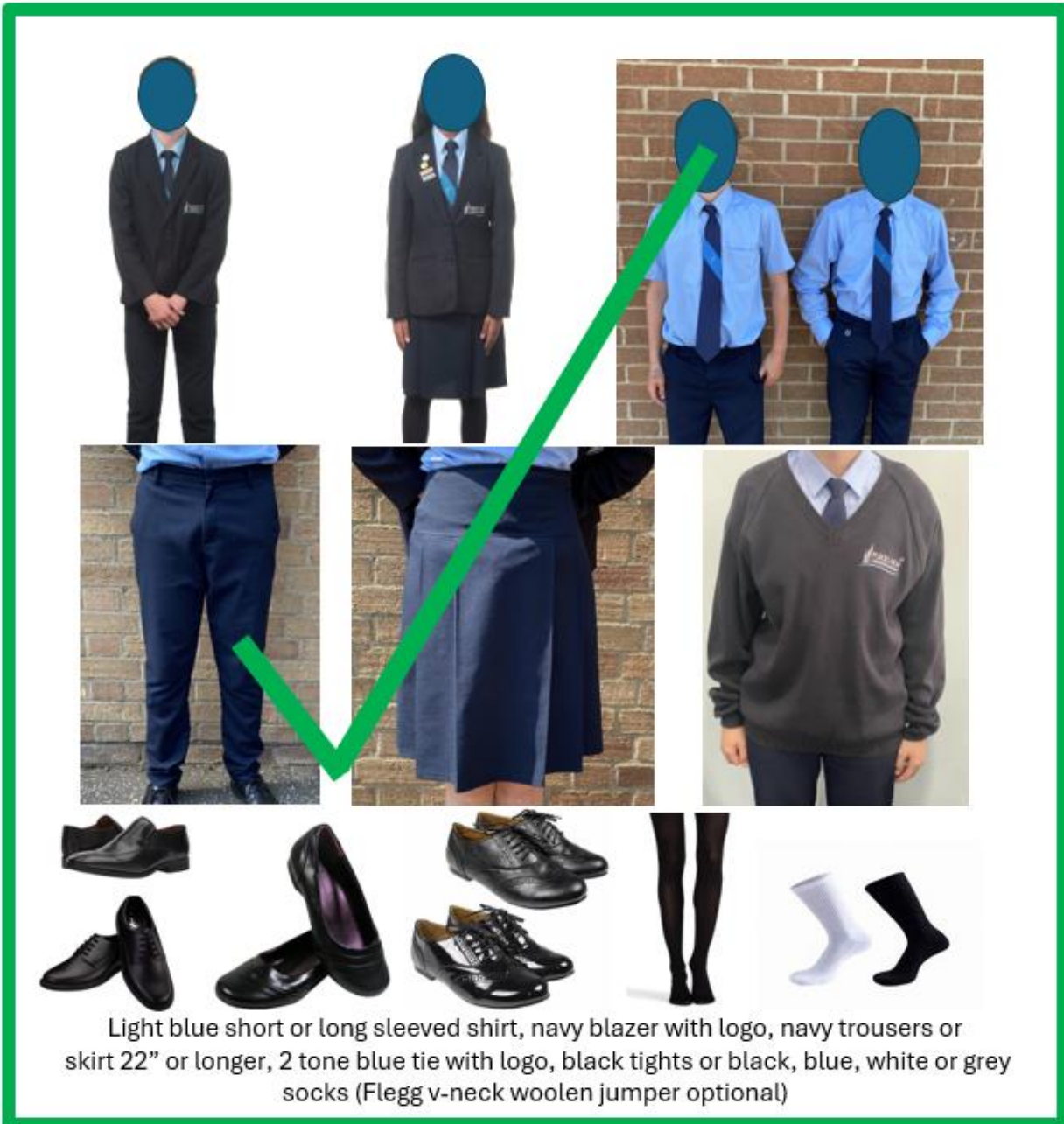

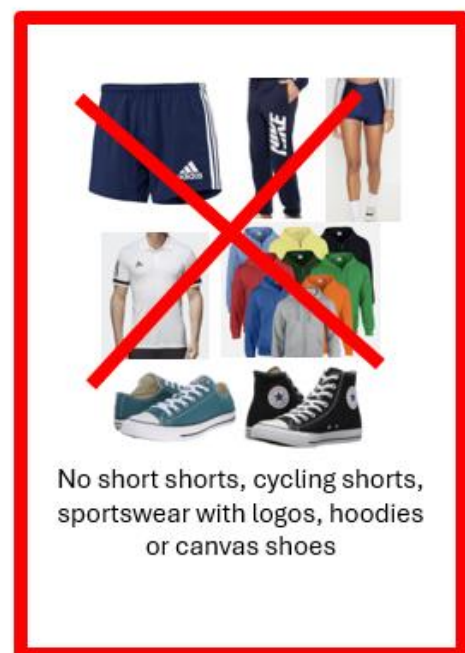
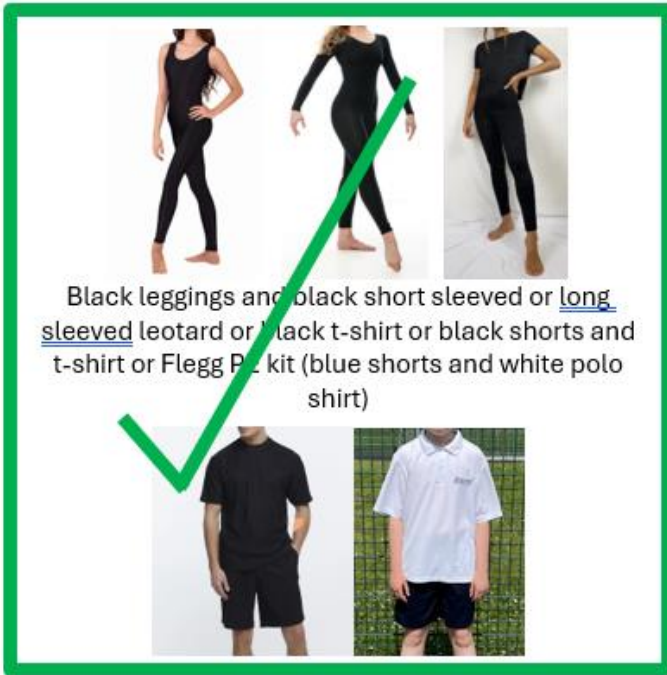

Blazer	Navy blue, tailored blazer with the school logo (can only be purchased at Harrisons)
Jumper (Optional)	Navy blue woollen V neck jumper with the school logo (can only be purchased at Harrisons) Or Plain navy blue woollen V neck jumper (can be purchased from any other outlet)
Shirt	Plain light blue short or long sleeved shirt (can be purchased at Harrisons or any other outlet)
Tie	2 tone blue tie with school logo (can only be purchased at Harrisons or the Academy)
Skirt	Navy blue 4 drop pleat 22" length skirt or longer to ensure skirt is knee length (can be purchased from either Harrisons or any other outlet but must look the same and meet the specification of being navy blue 4 drop pleat skirt that is a minimum of 22" in length)
Trousers	Navy blue boys/girls tailored trousers (can be purchased at Harrisons or any other outlet but must be tailored trousers and not skinny legged or cropped)
Shoes	Black flat shoes - boots or canvas style shoes are not permitted (can be purchased from any outlet)
Socks / Tights	Black tights and black, navy blue, white or grey socks (can be purchased from any outlet)
PE Top	White polo shirt with school logo (can only be purchased at Harrisons) or Plain white polo shirt (can be purchased from any other outlet)
Rugby Top (Optional)	2 tone blue rugby top (can only be purchased at Harrisons)

# Flegg Uniform Expectations

## Coats & Jackets

Navy blue or black are the preferred colour for outer garments worn when travelling to and from the academy. Denim jackets and hooded sweatshirts are not permitted. Coats/jackets should be free from slogans.

## Outer Garments

Coats, hats & scarves are not to be worn during lessons, assemblies or in the canteen. Hats, scarves and hoods should be removed whilst in corridors. Outer garments should be free from slogans.

## Clothing

All uniform and clothing must be clearly marked with the owner's name, including coats and PE kit.

## Jewellery

Students are allowed 1 small stud earring per ear. No other jewellery is permitted, this includes hoop earrings, rings, bracelets, necklaces or any other jewellery items. Students may wear a watch. Body modifications or piercings including tongue and belly button piercings are not allowed and students will be placed into Ready to Learn until this is rectified.

## Belts

A plain black belt is permitted with trousers, belts should not have decorative buckles.

## Hair

Extreme hair colouring/styles are not permitted, no shaved head, colours should only be natural hair colours, hair colour cannot be two tone. Patterns should not be shaved into hair.

## Make-up

Make-up is unnecessary, but if worn should be 'natural looking' and not obvious. False eyelashes are not permitted.

## Nails

Nail varnish, french manicured tips, acrylics and/or adornments are not permitted.

## Non-uniform days

Non-uniform days are used to raise awareness and funds for charities. In these circumstances, the clothes worn by students must still comply with these fundamental principles:

- They must be safe and practical for school use.
- They must not promote unacceptable messages – drugs, violence, racism etc.
- They must not conceal identity.
- They must not be indecent – no low cut or mid-drift tops or excessively short skirts/shorts.
- No jewellery is to be worn other than 1 small stud per ear.
- No coats, scarves or hats are to be worn in the building.
- No extreme hair colour.
- No false nails/eyelashes/excessive or obvious makeup.

## Mobile Phones

Mobile phones should never be seen or heard. While we understand there may be times when students need their phone to and from the academy, they should not be visible during the school day including break and lunch times and they will be confiscated if seen.



# Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are changing!

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued **after 19th August 2024**.

## **Per Parent, Per Child**

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent, for each child that was absent. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

## **National Threshold**

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period. These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence. The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

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## **First Offence**

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

- £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

## **Second Offence (within 3 years)**

- The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:
- £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

## **Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)**

- The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrate's Court. Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.
- Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.



## **Norfolk County Council: Penalty Notices regarding school absence - Guidance for parents**

### **Regular school attendance and parent's legal responsibilities**

At Flegg High Ormiston Academy our aim is to collaborate with parents to ensure that all our pupils receive the most from their education and reach their full potential.

This guidance is to remind all parents about the law that requires them to ensure that their child attends school regularly. The Government is clear that no child should miss school apart from in exceptional circumstances and schools must take steps to reduce absence to support children's attainment.

### **The important legal information – New from August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2024**

The Government have introduced a single national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England. This threshold is **10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period**. These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence. The period of 10 school weeks can span different terms or school years.

In line with national guidance, the Local Authority (LA) retains the discretion to issue a penalty notice before the threshold is met. This might apply for example, where parents have taken several term time holidays below the national threshold. The LA also retains the discretion to consider going straight to prosecution where appropriate.

A maximum of 2 penalty notices per parent, per child can be issued within a rolling 3-year period. This period will start from the issue of the 1<sup>st</sup> penalty notice. The national framework also sets out the escalation process which applies to such penalty notices. If the national threshold is met for a third time (or subsequent times) within 3 years, another tool should be used. In Norfolk, where a pupil's attendance has met the national threshold for a third time within 3 years and the parent/s have already been issued with 2 penalty notices within that period, consideration will be given to prosecution under section 444 of the Education Act 1996, which can result in a criminal conviction and fine of up to £2,500.

A parent includes any person who is not a natural parent but who has parental responsibility for the child **or** who has care of the child, as set out in section 576 of the Education Act 1996. Penalty notices will usually be issued to the parent/s with day-to-day responsibility for the child's attendance or the parent/s who have allowed the absence (regardless of which parent has applied for a leave of absence).

The first penalty notice issued to a parent for a child will be charged at £160 to be paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days. Where it is deemed appropriate to issue a second penalty notice, the second penalty notice to the same parent for the same child within 3 years of the first offence, is charged at a flat rate of £160 and is payable within 28 days.

**There is no reduced sum available in this instance.**

Part payments or payment plans are not acceptable, and fines must be paid in full within 21 or 28 days, at the rate specified within the penalty notice. There is no right of appeal against a penalty notice.

## **Requests for leave of absence**

[Working together to improve school attendance](#) advises all schools that they should only grant a leave of absence during term time in exceptional circumstances, considering each request on a case-by-case basis. If a leave of absence is granted, it is for the headteacher to determine the length of time the pupil can be away from school. Although we recognise the value and benefits of family holidays, it is unlikely a leave of absence will be granted for a family holiday as the Government 'does not consider a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation to be an exceptional circumstance.'

Requests for leave must be made in advance, otherwise schools will be unable to consider your individual circumstances and the absence will be recorded as unauthorised. Headteachers are not obligated to reconsider authorising leave if an application was not made in advance.

## Online Safety advice for parents and carers

### What Parents & Educators Need to Know about ONLINE TROLLING

The term "Trolling" refers to sending hurtful or provocative comments – often done anonymously online – to provoke a reaction or cause emotional distress. Anonymity can embolden people into saying things they wouldn't dare say in person. Euro 2024 and other tournaments tend to put an emphasis on this, with the abuse of both players and fans often increasing during such events.

#### WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

#### ESCALATION

Many trolls begin with silly, banal comments before moving on to a broader pattern of offensive messages and posts. They can also turn their attention very quickly to a new target if they grow bored with an existing one, which makes engaging with one fruitless at best – and potentially dangerous at worst.

#### HIDE BEHIND A SCREEN

Because trolls tend to use anonymous profiles, they enjoy a lack of accountability. This also means they'll often have multiple profiles, potentially switching between them regularly or posting across several of them at the same time, making a target feel as though there's no escape. After all, once you block one account, what's to stop them reappearing elsewhere?

#### 24/7 CONTACT

The internet has given us the ability to remain in contact at any time, from almost anywhere in the world. A troll having the ability to reach you whenever they want can leave you feeling like their abuse is unavoidable. While they don't see you in real life, they can message you at any time, reach out to your peers online and even try to discover your personal information to scare you.

#### HATE SPEECH

Sadly, many trolls resort to spewing racial slurs, homophobic attacks and awful stereotypes, as these often stand the best chance of causing emotional harm. This can add a hefty degree of weight to their attacks, moving from what might charitably be described as "teasing" into a genuine hate crime. After Euro 2020, three England footballers were racially abused, resulting in several prison sentences.

#### IMPACT ON VICTIMS

It's not uncommon for the victims of trolls to shut down their accounts, disappear from public life, and try to stay out of the crosshairs for a time – with some even leaving social media forever. This can have a severe impact on children and young people's connections to friends and the world at large, and may not even actually stop the troll. The victims' families, for example, may have online profiles that trolls can still access.

#### NORMALISATION OF TROLLING

It is, regrettably, inevitable that some people will go too far in their criticisms or comments, both online and in the real world. This can lead to many people seeing trolls and their abuse as part and parcel of social media – an inherent risk of interacting with others online. This doesn't mean, however, that it should be considered "normal" or even tolerated.

### Advice for Parents & Educators

#### USE PARENTAL CONTROLS

While social media platforms (where most trolling tends to happen) aren't always helpful when responding to abusive behaviour, parents can set up screen time limits, so children only get to use certain apps at certain times. There's always the potential for trolling to occur anyway – such as friends showing screenshots to one another – but this would minimise the likelihood of children seeing it.

#### DON'T ENGAGE WITH ABUSE

A well-known adage on social media is "don't feed the trolls". Fundamentally, if a child identifies a potential troll online, it's best not to engage with that individual directly. Instead, consider setting up a log to gather evidence for reporting them later on, including screenshots and quotes where possible.

#### ENCOURAGE EMPATHY

While every professional athlete aspires to maintain high standards, it's important to separate the player from the person. A player's performance doesn't make them worthy of abuse, and that can often be forgotten by younger children who simply see the colour of the shirt without considering the person wearing it. For all the rivalries between teams, it's essential children understand that players are still human beings, with families and lives outside of sport.

#### BLOCK AND REPORT

While anonymous accounts make it difficult to block trolls permanently – or even for very long – it's still good practice to help children learn to control who can engage with them online. It's not worth "feeding the trolls", and it's more helpful to block them, report them, and try to move on. Blocking and reporting is an anonymous process, too, so there'll be no indication of who specifically blew the whistle.
