# Year 10 is the start of Key Stage 4



- In year 10 you will start studying for formal qualifications
- These qualifications are very important for your future they will dictate your next steps
- There are two different types of qualification:
  - GCSEs
  - Vocational awards
- Key stage 4 is made up of CORE subjects and OPTIONS subjects





## The English Baccalaureate



- The EBacc is a set of GCSE subjects that are recognised as the best for enabling you to access university courses in the future.
- They are viewed as being the best academic pathway. You should consider this if you are considering taking A-Levels or going to university after school.
- In order to achieve the EBacc, you will need to study:
  - English Language and English Literature
  - Mathematics
  - Science (your best 2 grades including computer science if you choose it)
  - Geography or History
  - French or Spanish

# How will you be assessed?



- When choosing your options, you can pick GCSEs or Vocational Qualifications
- GCSEs are graded from 9-1
- Most GCSE subjects are assessed by 100% examination at the end of the course.
- Vocational qualifications (BTEC or WJEC Vocational awards) are graded from Distinction\* to Level 2 Pass, there are also some Level 1 grades.
- They are approximately 60% in lesson coursework and 40% examination
- They will have a work/industry focus

#### Research

- Read about the course in your booklet
- Explore careers what subjects will help you achieve your career aims?

#### Consider

- O Which subjects interest you?
- O Where do your strengths lie?
- O Which subjects do your teachers recommend?
- O Which subjects will you be most successful in?







#### How to choose



- Deciding after the RESEARCH!
  - O Do you understand what will be expected of you?
  - O Do you understand how you will be assessed?
  - Are you choosing for YOU?
- Preferences
  - Choose 3 subjects from EACH option block







#### How to choose your Sport pathway



- Read all 3 pathways carefully
  - If you want to study PE/sport further, then you should take BTEC Sport or choose GCSE PE as an option

#### Preferences

- Rank the 3 options in order of preference
- If you choose GCSE PE as an option, you will have to choose Sports Leadership or Health and Physical Activity as your Core pathway to ensure this complements the course.





#### What to do



- Read the options booklet in detail at home
  - Speak to subject teachers and subject leaders for advice on subject make sure you understand the assessment model
  - Speak to your form tutor for advice
  - Use links available in options booklet
- Complete options form choose 3 top choices for each block
- Rank your core sport pathway with your preferred choice first.
  - Choose subjects that are interesting and that you enjoy.
  - Think about future study and career paths.
  - Stick to deadlines!
  - Pick subjects you like, not what your friend picks
  - Do not pick subjects based on your favourite teachers
