CRICKET

What a fantastic year of sport we have had this year at Flegg. We have had many outstanding performances in a range of sports, competing at the top for Norfolk honours.

Boys cricket made a return this year with U14s and U12s competing at the semi-final for the county cup. The girls softball teams did exceptionally well winning most of their games.



FOOTBALL

Football at Flegg is always big and well followed due to our local teams and the amount of work they put into grassroot football. This year we managed to get to two county cup finals in year 10 and 11, winning the year 10 one 4-1 in the final against Cliff Park and missing out 2-0 to Framingham Earl in the year 11 encounter. All teams played at least 6 games with many playing more due to their cup runs. Our students are proud to wear the navy and royal blue Flegg tops and looking forward to another competitive year next year!



BASKETBALL

Basketball is back, and Flegg students have had many opportunities playing other schools this year. This year we entered the year 7s and 8s into the NBA junior leagues, where they played at least four fixtures each against teams from around the Norwich/Yarmouth area. Both year groups managed to win games and compete in all fixtures. The year 7s managed to make the playoffs but unfortunately lost in the first round.



RUGBY

Rugby this year was another success story especially for the year 9s who managed to get themselves to a plate semifinal. En-route to the semi final they managed to beat teams such as Aylsham, Hellesdon, and Acle. All year groups (boys and girls) had two opportunities this year to compete in tournaments against other schools in Norfolk. These were the emerging schools tournament and the North Walsham Viking Days. In both competitions all year groups were competitive winning many games and had lots of opportunities to develop as rugby players. This year has given Flegg students a chance to learn the game and be competitive.

ATHLETICS

Athletics this year has been another success due to the young determined athletes we have. All summer, our students have been working hard and practicing for their events whether that is in lessons or at clubs. This has all paid off with many of the year groups placing high against other schools within the area.



The year 7's came 3"d at Wellesley and 2"d in the OAT sports cup, the year 8's came 3"d at Wellesley and 4th at the OAT sports cup, the year 9's came 2"d at Wellesley and 3th at the OAT sports cup where as the year 10s came 1th at Wellesley and 1th at the OAT sports cup. As a school both at the Wellesley Athletics and OAT Sport cup we came 3th overall which is a fantastic achievement. Also to add we had 3 pupils represent the county and English schools this year within Athletics. Faye Nottage represented Norfolk in cross country, whereas Maisy Boylan and Amy Fielding represented Norfolk in 200m and 100m respectively. Maisy managed to secure a bronze medal in her 200m final.

NETBALL



The Under 16s this year qualified as district winners for the National schools competition and finished 4th in section. Whereas the Under 15s qualified for the league winners competition and managed to get through to the semifinals held at the UEA. The Under 13s went to Grashams school for county netball tournament and got through to the plate pay-offs which was a great achievement. Successes this year for each year were, Yr 10 - winners of tournament & league. Yr 9 - winners of first tournament, 3th in league and tournament. Yr 8 - 2th in all competitions leagues and tournament. Finally, Yr7 - developing side did not win many matches as many did other clubs so did not requirely attend training
