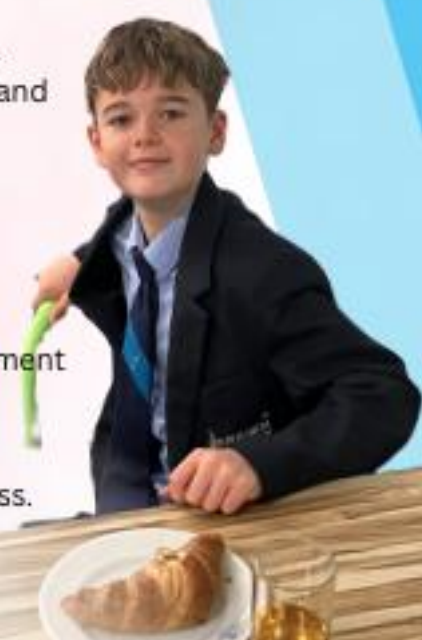

Team Spirit Shines in the College Clash

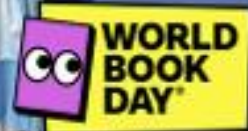
